Rural Transportation

The ability of rural seniors and adults with disabilities to age well at home is largely dependent on the availability of reliable, affordable, and accessible transportation.

Having access to transportation for medical appointments, shopping, and social connection is an important need for the seniors and adults with disabilities ROSSS serves in rural Ottawa South. Diminished capacity to drive, the difficulty posed by rural roads (especially during inclement weather), and the lack of public transportation, make the need for transportation services essential for seniors and adults with disabilities to remain in their rural homes.

ROSSS' transportation program is well-recognized for its exceptional service and the fundamental role it plays in supporting seniors and adults with disabilities to age well at home in the rural communities we serve. Prepandemic, ROSSS provided up to 12,000 rides annually and we are steadily increasing the number of rides we provide annually back to pre-pandemic numbers as more appointments, programs, and social engagements return to in-person.

ROSSS' transportation program is exceptional for several reasons, including:

- Our helpful and friendly scheduling team makes booking transportation easy.
- Our fleet of vehicles meets the unique mobility needs of seniors and adults with disabilities – including the capacity to provide wheelchair transportation.
- Our drivers, both staff and volunteer, have an outstanding reputation for their amazing service! Not only are they great drivers, but they also ensure that you safely arrive at your destination with our door-through-door service.
- Our service is affordable. With the cost of \$11.00 for a round trip under 30 KM and \$19.50 for a round trip over 30 KM within Ottawa's city limits, the price of our service is a fraction of the cost of a taxi or a private driving service.

In 2022-2023, we provided 8,160 drives and ensured that our clients still had access to essential transportation as the pandemic continued during the past year. We take great pride in our ability to provide transportation throughout the last year to important appointments and critical medical treatments while ensuring the safety and well-being of our clients during another challenging year.

With our focus on strengthening our core mission to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to age well in their rural communities, we will continue to work on strengthening and improving our transportation program – guaranteeing it meets the needs of our clients and supports their goal of remaining in their homes for as long as they desire.

Volunteers

Volunteers have always been a huge part of ROSSS. We say it often but the programs and services we provide would not be the success they are, were it not for the support and helping hands we have from so many kind-hearted souls.

- Drivers transport our clients to hospital appointments, social engagements, the grocery store, for hair appointments.
- Friendly Visiting provides clients in need of companionship, with a caring volunteer who will spend a couple of hours, once or twice a week, playing scrabble and laughing over a cuppa.
- Connections volunteers are a sociable bunch who enjoy joining in on a game of Bingo, telling jokes and sharing fun facts, over coffee and cake.
- At the Adult Day Program, volunteers help set up the space for a day of fun, laughter, and companionship. They cook, clean, serve and still find time to take part in the activities and games, present each week.
- Pickleball volunteers get their exercise as well as run the fun activity. The sessions are currently held twice a week and are very popular.
- Cultured Purls is another volunteer run program which brings together those who love to knit and be sociable at the same time.
- Gardening is a popular request during the spring and summer months and many clients would miss having the assistance of student and adult volunteers to keep their weeds down and their flower beds neat.
- Snow-shoveling requests are also another popular request and during the winter months volunteers will keep client walkways clear and safe.
- It would be nigh on impossible to run Meals on Wheels without the reliability and consistency of the volunteers we have. Not only do they deliver the meals, but they add a social connection to the client who may not have contact with another person that day.
- The same goes for Grocery Delivery, volunteers need to be committed. They also need a good back and strong arms to lug those bins around!
- Volunteers are required to assist at the Special Events we hold throughout the year. The tasks range from setting up for the event, handing out and providing ROSSS information, walking in parades, and anything required to help the event run as smoothly as possible.
- The Board of Directors volunteers provide their expertise and input to ensure that ROSSS is running to the best of the agency's ability.
- A Friendly Voice volunteers are just a phone call away bringing a ray of sunshine through conversation and laughter.




Spotlighting residents who are thriving independently at home with your support.


